PREPARING FOR ONLINE LEARNING SUCCESS

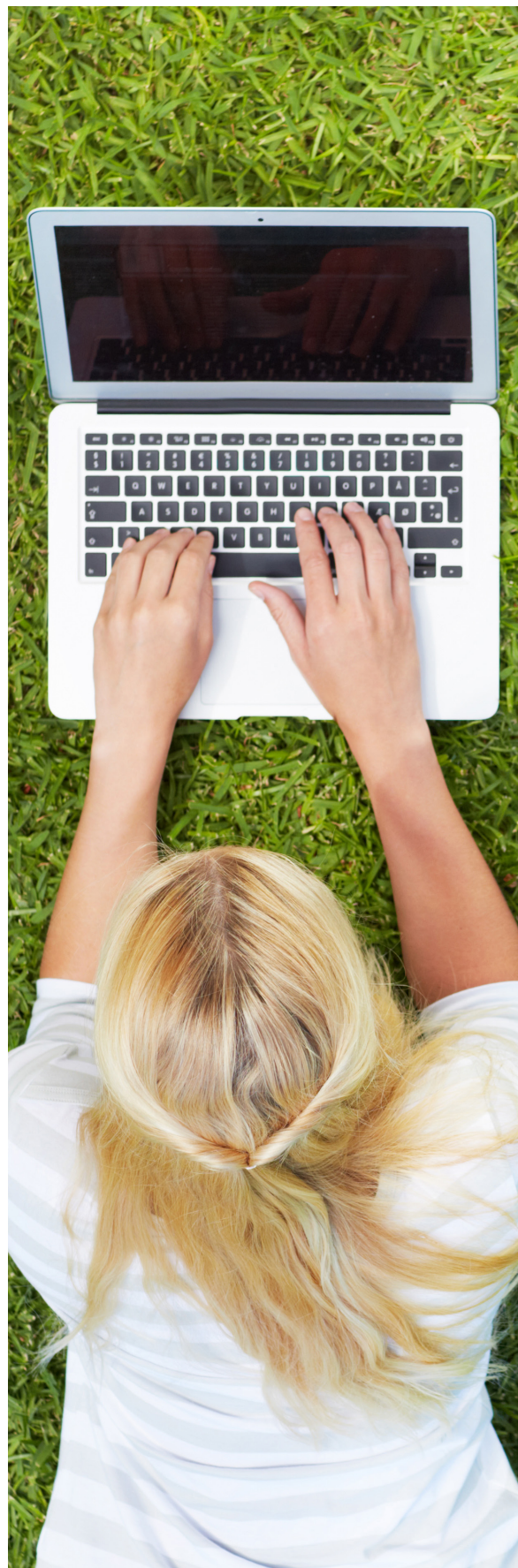
- Meet with an academic advisor at the college where you are enrolled
- Register for TN eCampus course sections offered in your college's course registration system. TN eCampus courses are numbered as shown below:
 - * R50 – R79 (full-term courses)
 - * R80+ (learning support courses)
 - * R01 – R24 (seven-week courses offered at beginning of semester)
 - * R25 – R49 (seven-week courses offered in middle of semester)
 - * R35- 10-week term
- Purchase textbooks, access codes and course materials through the TN eCampus virtual bookstore
- Know when classes begin and end
- Designate a dedicated work/study space
- Plan your study time
- Check the course calendar regularly
- Read the course syllabus and course announcements.
- Communicate with your professor
- Follow directions for participation in class assignments
- Use the free virtual library and tutoring
- Complete assignments with time to spare
